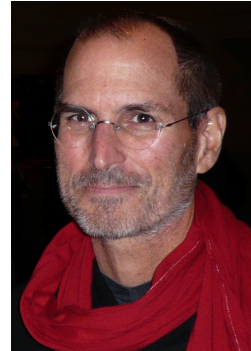


Michael Ignatieff (born 1947) is a Canadian author, academic historian, former senior politician and broadcaster. His fiction and non-fiction works have won many literary awards.

Alastair McIntosh (born 1955) is writer, teacher, theologian and social activist. He is best known for his book, *Soil and Soul – people versus corporate power*.

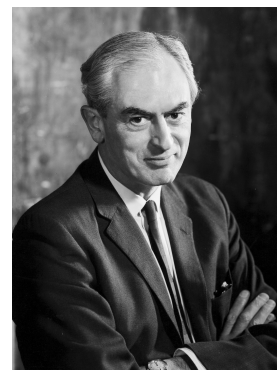

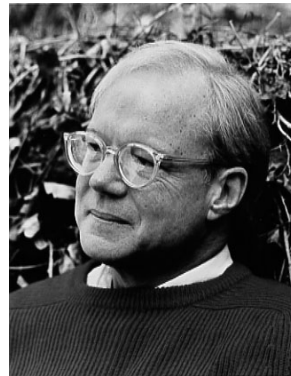

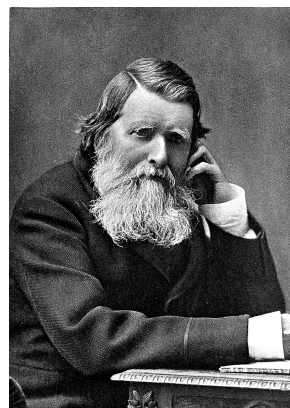
